# Old Testament

---

**In order to get the most understanding out of your reading I suggest the following:**

- 1) Pray to God for understanding.
- 2) A good Bible (KJV, NKJV, ESV or NASB) (Newer translations can bring the Old Testament to life for those who find the Old Testament challenging to read and understand (Reading a text in multiple translations helps).
- 3) Read an introduction to the Bible book you are reading (many bibles have them at the beginning of each book).
- 4) Use a Bible dictionary for words that you may not be familiar with.
- 5) A Bible concordance (to find words and definitions of words), also a Greek/Hebrew Lexicon (dictionary) may be helpful.
- 6) Bible Atlas to locate places that you read about (most bibles have them in the back).
- 7) Read it purposefully to discover what God's will is so that you may apply it to your life.

**Remember to effectively study the Bible you must first:**

- 1) Read the Text (Chapter or chapters and - in some cases - the entire book)
- 2) Interpret the Text (What does the Bible mean? What was the author's intent in writing and how would the audience have understood the author?)
- 3) Apply the Text (Now that I know what it means - how do I apply it properly to my life).

**I would suggest in some cases reading along while listening to an audio version online, etc.**

**Also, I would suggest that you read aloud when you have the opportunity.**

**Note: Our goal is to get to know God more perfectly - this is primarily accomplished through seeing Him in His Word.**
