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Study the Bible.

Learning the 66 Books of the Bible (Genesis – Revelation).

Continue to memorize and go over the New Testament books. There are 27 New Testament books (**Matthew – Revelation**) (see back).

Read chapters from the book of Acts - the 5th book of the New Testament (Church History).

The History of the New Testament Church Acts 1 - 28

Read the Sermon on Pentacost Acts 2

Read and analyze Stephen's Message Acts 7

Remember: You can listen to the Bible on Online or on CDs.

Substitute the time you would normally sit watching television or some other activity with reading God's Word. It will make a great difference. The objective is to make reading God's Word a daily habit. **You can do it!**

Practice the Bible.

The early church was extremely evangelistic in the first century. Take steps to win souls to Christ by telling others about the gospel (good news) that saves.

The early church met on the first day of week to worship God. (Acts 2:42; Acts 20:7) Do you make every effort to attend worship services A.M. and P.M.? Do you make every effort to attend Sunday and Wednesday Bible study classes?

The early church had a desire to help fellow Christians who were in need? (Act 2:45; 3:32-36)

Do you view all humans as one race created in God's image who are only culturally different? (Acts 10-11; Acts 17:26)

The early church devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching (doctrine). (Acts 2:42) Are you actively listening when the word of God is being presented? Do you make every effort to study the word of God and search daily the truths found therein (Acts 17:11)?

Teach the Bible.

Tell someone what you have studied and how you have sought to apply it to your life.

- Rehearse orally the content of Peter's sermon at Pentacost.
- Rehearse orally the events that led to the stoning of Stephen.
- Rehearse orally three conversion accounts found in Acts.
- Write a paraphrase of the details of what you have studied.

Family Bible Study

Think about what might be the best time to lead your family in the Bible Study and for how long. Those who are single should do the same. (Adjusting for small children.)
