- James 3:6 And the tongue is a fire, a world of unrighteousness. The tongue is set among our members, staining the whole body, setting on fire the entire course of life, and set on fire by hell.
- James 3:7 For every kind of beast and bird, of reptile and sea creature, can be tamed and has been tamed by mankind,
- James 3:8 but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison.

INSULTS

- Matthew 5:21 "You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment.'
- Matthew 5:22 But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, 'You fool!' will be liable to the hell of fire.

ANGER LIVES IN THE HEART OF FOOLS

• Ecclesiastes 7:9 Be not quick in your spirit to become angry, for anger lodges in the heart of fools.

BE WISE

• Proverbs 29:11 A fool gives full vent to his spirit, but a wise man quietly holds it back.

A MAN WITHOUT SELF-CONTROL

• Proverbs 25:28 A man without self-control is like a city broken into and left without walls.

SOFT ANSWER TURNS AWAY WRATH

 Proverbs 15:1 A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.

A HOT-TEMPERED MAN STIRS UP STRIFE

• Proverbs 15:18 A hot-tempered man stirs up strife, but he who is slow to anger quiets contention.

DO NOT SIN, RESOLVE ISSUES QUICKLY

- Ephesians 4:26 Be angry and do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger,
- Ephesians 4:27 and give no opportunity to the devil.

PUT AWAY ANGER

• Colossians 3:8 But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth.

REPLACE ANGER WITH A FORGIVING HEART

- Ephesians 4:31 Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice.
- Ephesians 4:32 Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.

KEEPING COMPANY WITH ANGRY PEOPLE CAN RUB OFF ON YOU

- Proverbs 22:24 Make no friendship with a man given to anger, nor go with a wrathful man,
- Proverbs 22:25 lest you learn his ways and entangle yourself in a snare.

SOMETIMES IT'S BEST TO JUST LET IT GO

• Proverbs 19:11 Good sense makes one slow to anger, and it is his glory to overlook an offense.

VENCEANCE BELONGS TO GOD

•Romans 12:19 Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord."
